How to Make a Rainstick Instrument

Supplies Needed:

- Sturdy cardboard tube such as a paper-towel, wrapping paper or cardboard tube from an aluminum foil roll
- Paint, crayons or markers
- Rubber bands
- Scissors
- Beads, rice, beans, or other material for inside the rainstick
- Varn

Directions:

- 1. Paint, color or decorate a cardboard tube.
- 2. Cut out two circles from a large, paper grocery bag. We crumpled the paper to make it soft and look worn. We also cut some fringe around the outside of the circle.



- 3. Attach one circle to the end of your cardboard tube using a rubber band.
- 4. Experiment with different ways to fill your rainstick. If you fill it with rice, beans or pebbles it will sound like a typical rainstorm.

5. Once you're happy with the sound of your rainstick, secure the other paper circle to the

opposite end using a rubber band.

6. Tie different colored pieces of yarn to each end.
