What is Inferential Genealogy?

Inferential Genealogy is how family historians can accurately deduce ancestors' identities and many aspects of their lives by digging below "surface information" in genealogical records and combining information from several sources. Useful in many situations, inferential methodology is especially helpful where records do not state relationships.

The process of piecing together documents to make conclusions about relationships and identities that no record tells you all by itself.

What is Kinship Determination?

"What is Kinship Determination?" It is the opposite of kinship acceptance. The process of figuring out the identity of an ancestor's parent, spouse, or child. Inferential genealogy is one method of kinship determination

Step 1 - Start with a Focused Goal

- Step 2 Search Broadly
- **Step 3 Understand the Records**
- **Step 4 Correlate the Records**
- Step 5 Write Down the Results

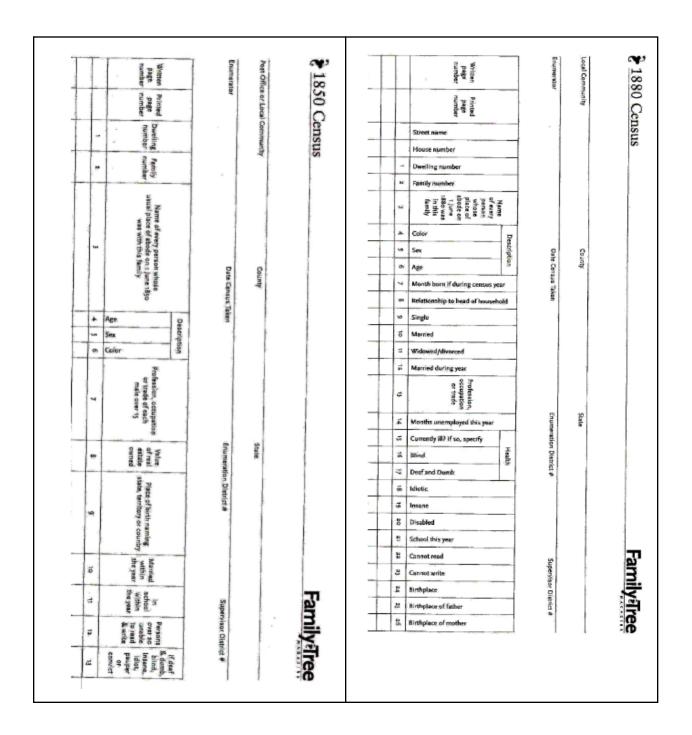

Why don't I know Elizabeth W Howard's birth surname.

One of the "rules" for my data entry, IF I do not know a name, I use 5 Underscores (_____) for the Given Name and / or the Surname, or both.

When I created the Name, I entered the Census Years, where I should have found her, 1840, 1850, 1860, 1870). That is why the State, Place, and Description or address was blank. When I created the EXCEL spreadsheet, those are the dates I should have or would like to have researched (if needed) The fact that they were blank, is that I hadn't looked for those records, because they were not important for that study. The data would NOT have been impacted by a Research Question. Had I still not been able to answer my question, I can see where I need to research further.
